



Sermon Introduction

Back to Basics: Going back to basics is an important choice to make in any endeavor worth doing. The basics of any undertaking in life normally provide the foundation on which every other step in the growth process is built Because of that, we ought never get very far from the basics.

For example, on occasion, in pre-marital counseling sessions, couples have asked me, "How do we make our marriage a success? How do we keep from becoming another divorce statistic?" My answer is quite simple: "Keep doing what you're doing now. Keep talking, listening, touching, sharing life. Because if you keep doing what you're doing now, you'll keep getting, in return, then, what you're getting now."

The same is true for so many other undertakings in life. A football team should never wander far from the basics of blocking, tackling, and holding onto the ball. The pianist should never wander too far from practicing scales. The nurse should never forget the love for patients that drew her or him into that field. The car owner needs to remember to change the oil, rotate the tires, and check the fluid levels on a regular basis. In other words, the basics are typically key to success in life.

Would it not stand to reason, then, that the same would be true in the discipleship journey with Jesus? I firmly believe that the answer to that question is a resounding yes! As such, today we begin the process of going Back to Basics. For five weeks, we will examine and commit or recommit to the basics of our discipleship journey with Jesus. In that process, our focus will be on five key basics: placing our faith in Jesus, repentance, listening to the Spirit in our lives, prayer, and active response to God's work in our lives.

Here's my hope-my prayer, really: that we each will walk away from this time together more deeply committed to Jesus than we are as we begin the journey together-that we will all go Back to Basics.
