In support of that thought, our minds urn to Peter's powerful sermon recorded in Acts 2. Peter lifts his voice to the crowd, telling them the tory of Jesus and his crucifixion. The Holy Spir alls powerfully on the gathered crowd, listeners are cut to the heart, their consciences are prickea, and they cryour. Brothers, what shall we do? (Acls 2.37, olied, 'Repent and be baptized, every one of you in the name of Jesus Christ for the forgiveness of your sins"' (Acts 2:38, TNIV),

So there it is-right at the beginning of their walk with Jesus. "Repent! Turn to God! Confess your ins. And you will receive the forgiveness of God.
