





Sermon Introduction

I've come to believe that the experience behind the statement. You don't listen to me. is deeply damaging to a relationship. On the other hand, to have a relational quality which can honestly say, He/she really listens to me, is to enjoy one of the sweetest fruits that relationships have to offer us. In fact, I would go so far as to say that the most accurate test of the level of intimacy in a relationship is to ask, How well does each person <u>listen</u> to the other person? That reality is underlined by something I remember my predecessor, Dr. William Loveless, saying in a sermon. In speaking of these matters, Bill said, "The human organ of intimacy is the ear!"

Truthfully, though, listening is one of the hardest tasks of a healthy relationship. Our lives are so busy and our world is so noisy that taking the time to stop and listen isn't just challengingsometimes it actually feels impossible to do! And yet, if we don't do it, our relationships will suffer accordingly.

Now, right about now, I can almost hear someone say to me, "Randy, we're not children! You don't need to educate us on something so basic as listening!"

Well, let me stop you right there. You are right, of course. Listening is basic. But that's the whole point of this current sermon series! Back to Basics! That's precisely what we're doing! In light of that, I want to draw a straight line from our human relationships to our relationship with God. And in doing so, I want to underline the fact that if listening is fundamental to healthy relationships with others, it is just as (if not more) fundamental to our relationship with God. And if listening is hard in our relationships with others, it is even harder in our relationship with God. But we *must* do it!

At that point, you likely have the same question I have: How does one "listen" to God? After all. I can literally listen to my wife's voice. I can hear her tone, sense her mood, notice her facial expression, respond to her in real time and then listen to her response. But God?! . . . How do I "listen" to God?

Well, I'm glad you asked! That's the very question we face today! So join me as we go back to the basic of listening to God.
