Sermon Introduction

Communication is a two-way street. We listen and we speak. Our relationship with God—and our communication with God—contains the same elements. Even with God we listen (primarily through Scripture), and we speak (primarily through prayer). Today we focus on that second dynamic in our relationship with God, the *speaking* part, the *prayer* part. In doing so, I decided to simply share a variety of different statements that notable *pray-ers* have made. How might these sentiments deepen your prayer journey with God?

"Don't pray when you feel like it. Have an appointment with the Lord and keep it. A man is powerful on his knees." (Corrie ten Boom)

"The little estimate we put on prayer is evidence from the little time we give to it." (E. M. Bounds)

"Prayer is not overcoming God's reluctance, but laying hold of His willingness." (Martin Luther)

"There is not in the world a kind of life more sweet and delightful than that of a continual conversation with God." (Brother Lawrence)

"I would rather teach one man to pray than ten men to preach." (Charles Spurgeon)

"Prayer is the acid test of devotion." (Samuel Chadwick)

"True prayer is measured by weight, not by length. A single groan before God may have more fullness of prayer in it than a fine oration of great length." (Charles Spurgeon)

"Prayer does not fit us for the greater work; prayer is the greater work." (Oswald Chambers)

"Prayer is not monologue, but dialogue. God's voice in response to mine is its most essential part." (Andrew Murray)

May your *speaking* to God—your prayer life—be rich and deep.

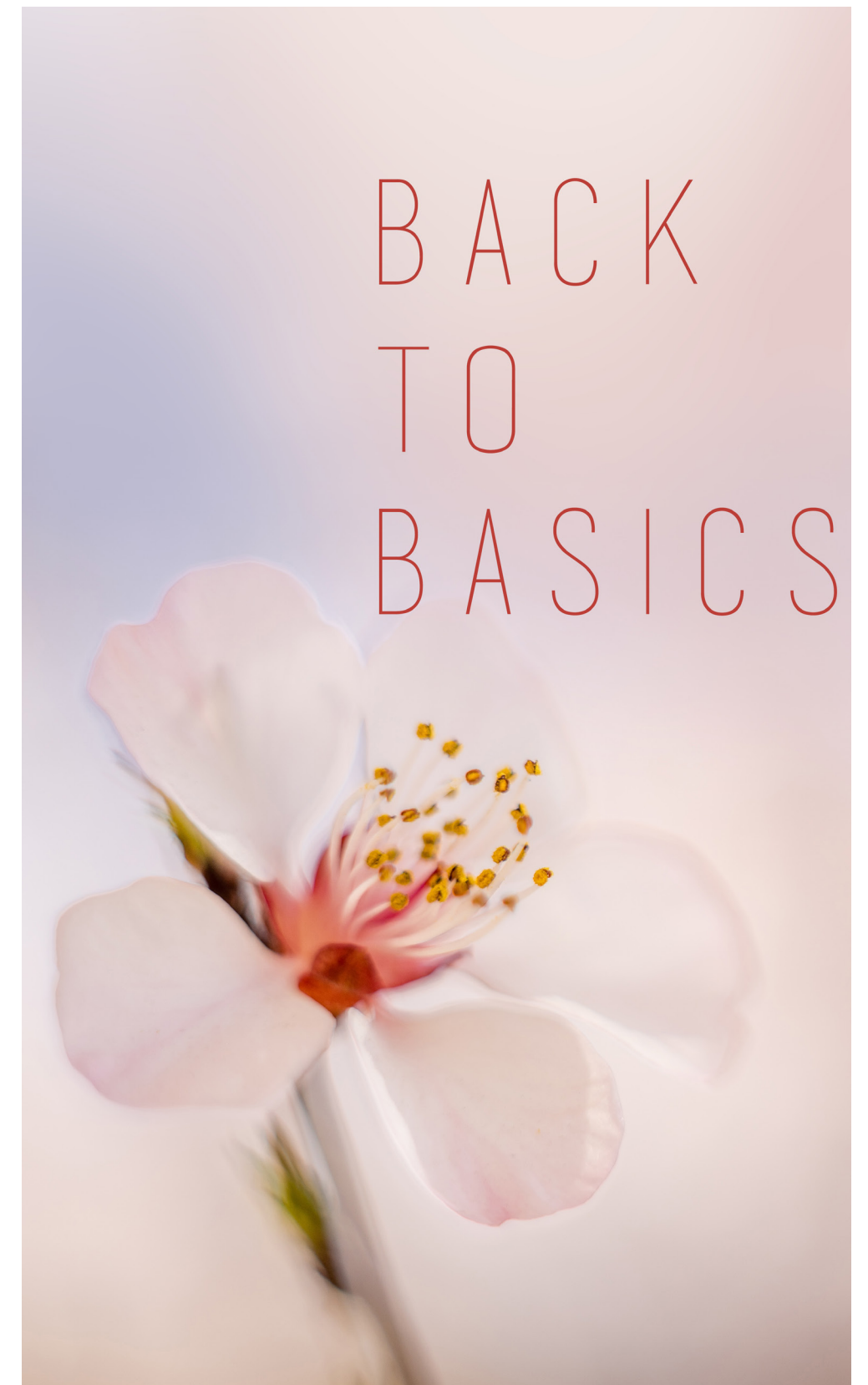

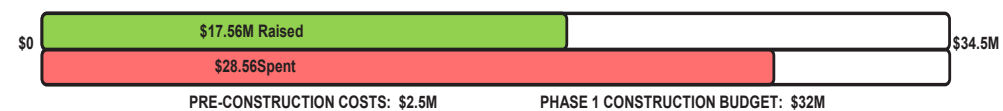
