

Bioethics Convocation—Life After Perfect: Kate Bowler, Duke University Divinity School professor and best-selling author, will speak on



Financial Corner



Sermon Introduction

Our current sermon series, Back to Basics, has taken four steps thus far: First step: Placing our belief in Jesus. Second step: Repenting of our failures by turning to God. Third step: Listening to God's voice in Scripture. Fourth step: Speaking to God regularly in prayer. And, today, the fifth step. Maybe it's best stated this way: At the end of the day, when all the listening and talking are over, the question is this, What am I going to do about it?

In other words, there comes a time on our discipleship journey with Jesus when it is time to act! It's time to do something about what we say we believe. Along those lines, I am caught by a story that appeared in an excerpt I read of a book written by Donald Miller. You might find it worth consideration.

The trouble with deep belief is that it costs something. And there is something inside me, some selfish beast of a subtle thing, that doesn't like the truth at all because it carries responsibility, and if I actually believe these

things I have to do something about them. . . .

I used to say that I believed it was important to tell people about Jesus, but I never did. [My friend] Andrew very kindly explained that if I do not introduce people to Jesus, then I don't believe Jesus is an important person. It doesn't matter what I say. (Donald Miller. Blue Like Jazz, 107, 110)

Did you catch that line? "If I actually believe these things I have to do something about them." Wow. That's straight to the point, isn't it? It's straight to the *heart*. And it forces us to face this question: What will I do about the four steps I've taken up to this point in this "Back to Basics" sermon series? Because if I believe, then I have to act.

Today is the day to answer that question. Today is the day to act, to do.
