Sermon Introduction

God has called us, his church, to be the hands and feet of Jesus, to take his justice and mercy into the world, to minister to the lost, the poor, and the broken. There is much at stake. The world we live in is under siege-three billion are desperately poor, one billion hungry, millions are trafficked in human slavery. Ten million children die needlessly each year. Wars and conflicts are wreaking havoc. Pandemic diseases are spreading. Ethnic hatred is flaming, and terrorism is growing.

What a wonderful example our Savior demonstrated while he was here on earth. Jesus healed the sick, loved the poor, touched the leper, stood up for the down-and-out, forgave the sinner, condemned the religious hypocrites, dined with prostitutes and corrupt tax collectors, challenged the wealthy and powerful, fought for justice for the oppressed, defied his culture, renounced materialism, demonstrated that greatness is found in serving. And by doing so, he changed the world. If we will do these same actions today as his followers, we can change our world.

Today we embark on a three-part series titled 6:8 Religion. The focus text is Micah 6:8, where this Old Testament prophet lays out the essence of what it means to be a Christian. In our scripture reading, the Lord reminds the people of all he has done for them: redeemed them from slavery in Egypt; turned Balak's curse into a blessing; and taught them about His faithfulness. In response, the people said, "Ok, so what does the Lord want from us? Burnt offerings? Offerings of yearling calves? Should we offer him thousands of rams and ten thousand rivers of olive oil? Or should we sacrifice our firstborn children to pay for our sins?"

Micah said, "No, O people, the Lord has told you what is good, and this is what he requires of you: to do justly, to love mercy, and to walk humbly with your God." Today, our focus is on doing justly.
