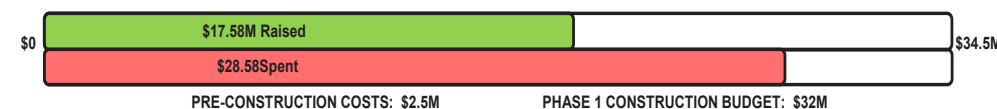
CHILD DEDICATION & BAPTISM

Sermon Introduction

It is easy to get overwhelmed by the expectations we encounter (seemingly) on every hand. The government expects us to pay taxes. The state expects us to do the same. The law expects us to obey the speed limit. (*But, in all honesty, who does?!*) Our bosses expect us—at times—to do more than any reasonable person could. Our spouses expect more of our time. Our bodies expect us to get more rest. And the list goes on—and on! In fact, just this morning I received one of the more angry emails I've received in a while. It came from a person who felt that *religion*—specifically, *my religion*, Seventh-day Adventism—expects way too much from its adherents.

And then there is God. . . . What does *God* expect from us? That is, no doubt, the most important question of all.

Well, maybe first we ought to think a moment about expectations. Someone once said to me that expectations are nothing more than invitations—invitations to anger and disappointment. Why? Because they are so seldom realized! The more I have thought about that—the more I have

lived!—the more convinced I am that it is true, so true, in fact, that had I been an adviser to Jesus on the Sermon on the Mount (*I was NOT, just in case you're wondering!*), I would have prodded him to add one more beatitude: "*Blessed is the one who has few expectations, for that one will be pleasantly surprised!*"

So, back to what *God* expects. . . . Does the writer of this morning's email have a point? Does the church have too many expectations? Or, to push it a big step further, does *God* have too many expectations?

We are in a short, three-part sermon series right now that helps us with an answer to that question. *6:8 Religion* takes us back to Micah 6:8 for the answer. And the answer is surprisingly short. Here is my paraphrase of it: "God has showed you what is good and what he expects from you: three things, *three simple things*, to act justly, to love mercy, and to walk humbly with God." *That is what God expects.*
