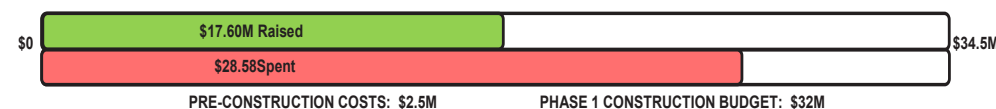

Sermon Introduction

What is *6:8 Religion*? The Old Testament prophet Micah answers the question in chapter 6 verse 8, and the answer is surprisingly brief. Here is my paraphrase of that answer: "God has showed you what is good, and what religion he expects from you—a religion characterized by three things—*three simple things*: to act justly, to love mercy, and to walk humbly with God." *That's* 6:8 religion. It is also the current sermon series, and today is our third and final study in this series. Today, our focus is on that last phrase: "Walk humbly with your God" (TNIV). So what does it mean to *walk humbly with God*?

First of all, "to walk" is another way of saying to *live in relationship with*. So Micah is speaking to us of the kind of relationship we have with God. Thus, when Micah uses this phrase, he is calling his people to an ongoing, vibrant, living relationship with God. And he said this in the context of a people who had come to the place of practicing their religion as *merely* empty rituals and ceremonies and rules. Micah, though, is calling them to a robust relationship with the Almighty God.

Then, *humility*. One of the ways that the dictionary defines humility is this: "A modest or low view of one's own importance." If we put that concept into the content of Micah's statement, then he is saying that in our life with God, we are to remember that *God is God, and we are not*. In other words, we are to maintain clearly in our minds the *limited* nature of being human. Such is not to disparage humanity or to suggest that we are not of immense value. *We are!* Calvary settles *that* question once and for all—we are of *immense* worth to God. But we are *limited*. We are *creatures*. There is a God above us to whom each must give an account. So a life with God must, of necessity, be characterized by humility.

So, *6:8 Religion* calls us to continually live in humble relationship with God. And that kind of relationship with God will certainly affect every other relationship in our lives. Such is the quality of life to which Micah called the people of his day, and such is the quality of life to which God calls us today.

May Jesus empower us to live that life!
