

Current Sermon Series

Fruitful

The Holy Spirit gives gifts—spiritual gifts—to each disciple in the body of Christ. These gifts are for use in the service of the church and of the world. There are different kinds of gifts, and disciples receive the gifts in varying quantities. The gifts are vital for the growth and maturity of the church.

But the Holy Spirit also does something else of great importance: the Holy Spirit produces *fruit* in the lives of growing disciples. While spiritual gifts vary in both number and kind, the *same* fruit of the Spirit (see Galatians 5:22-23) is given to *every* disciple. There is one fruit—the New Testament reference is in the singular—with various ingredients. The fruit is made up of love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness, and self-control.

Like the fruit in our back yards, the fruit of the Spirit takes time to grow to maturity. This process of growth requires attention, nurture, pruning, and surrender. The focus in this series is both on what the fruit of the Spirit is and how we can nurture its growth in our lives.
