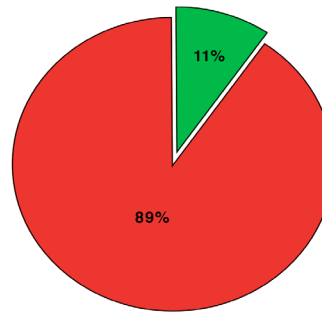

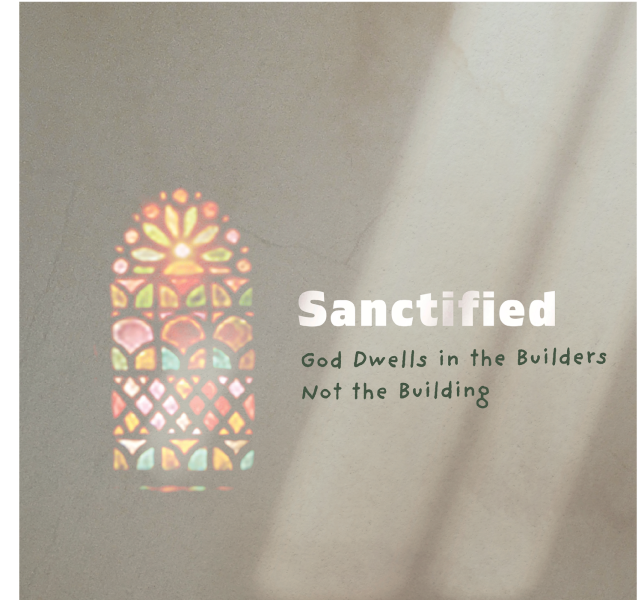
Sanctified; God Dwells in the Builders Not the Building
