



not about getting something out of it (though, doubtless, there are benefits associated with being in true community), but rather about contributing, sharing, giving, loving, and serving.

Further, we're in an age that is guite rootless, and rootlessness results in superficiality. In fact, the writer Richard Foster began one of his books with this sentence: Superficiality is the curse of our age (see Celebration of Discipline). True community is based on depth and reality. As such, it cannot exist in connection with superficiality.

So, again, where in your life are you committed to a community? If you would live a life that matters, community is required. For that reason, (and many others), I hope you can answer the question clearly. If you can't, maybe today can offer some guidance on that journey.
