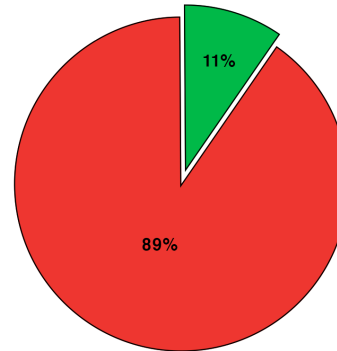

To BELieve or Not To BELieve—THAT is The Question
