# SABBATHS TOL ARE HIS **DERSONAL CONSERNAL OUT OF THE INFORMATION OF**

You Are His Personal Concern What if living without fear is possible?

What if living without fear is possible? How many lives would be changed by that one simple truth?

And what if one of those lives was yours?

Fear—and its close relative, *anxiety*—haunts countless people. It may gnaw at the pit of your stomach or shake you at the core of your being. It may raise the hair on the back of your neck or turn the hair on your head gray. It may slowly erode the core of your life or demolish the center of your spiritual life. But however you experience it, its effects are real and often overwhelming. So the prospect—even the slight possibility—of living without fear is most appealing. But *if such is possible*, how does one do it? Does such a solution come in a bottle of pills, a bottle of herbs, or a bottle of drink? Not in a bottle at all, it turns out, but in a book—a book that teach us the truth about God—the God whom we have too often misunderstood and of whom we have thus been afraid.

Maybe it's the truth about God that will heal our fear.




