

Sermon Introduction

Timothy Keller writes: "Prayer is both conversation and encounter with God. . . . We must know the awe of praising his glory, the intimacy of finding his grace, and the struggle of asking his help, all of which can lead us to know the spiritual reality

It's the phrase toward the end that particularly catches my attention . . . the struggle of asking

But then, that's true in other relationships as well, isn't it? After all, any marriage that goes the distance involves the reality of wrestling over certain issues, of talking through-or even fighting through-certain experiences.

On the one hand, most of us would rather not have such times. We would much rather have good feelings, agreement, unity, and joy. But if we are going to have honest relationships, wrestling is unavoidable. It is through such that we come to know and understand one another on a deeper level. It is from such experiences that we can emerge more deeply committed to each other. having grown closer.

Jacob is about to pass through such an experience with God. It is a climactic moment in his life. He will emerge from this experience with a limp and with a new name. It will be worth our time to linger over this passage, consider its meaning-for Jacob. and for us.
