The Gift... For Those on Whom God's Favor Rests

The heavenly chorus proclaimed the good news of Advent to the shepherds on the hills outside Bethlehem:

Suddenly a great company of the heavenly host appeared with the angel, praising God and saying,

"Glory to God in the highest heaven, and on earth peace to those on whom his favor rests." (Luke 2:13-14, NIV).

This is the best of all good news! Yet the last line raises a question: Upon exactly whom does God's favor rest?

As Luke recounts the story of Jesus, the answer to the question is stunning because throughout the ministry of Jesus, God's favor consistently rests upon the last people who ought to have expected to receive it.

Two thousand years later the news is still stunning! The identity of "those on whom his favor rests" is still astonishing because those who think they would never be the object of God's favor are about to receive the greatest Christmas of all: God's peace!
