Sermon Introduction

Most of us have received a gift we didn't want. And that poses a problem: it's too good to throw away, but too undesirable to keep. So, what do we do with it? Some decide that the best option is to give it to someone else. The popular cultural term to refer to that is *regifting*. Regifting is a particularly appealing practice at Christmastime. (Especially if you've ever gotten a fruitcake! If you have, then regift to your heart's delight!)

Too good to throw away, but too undesirable to keep. So let me ask: Is there an office Christmas party coming up and you don't know what gift to take? Do your kids have a class party next week but they don't have enough money to buy a gift? Is your dorm participating in a Secret Santa gift exchange and you can't afford the gift needed to participate? Don't worry about it! You already have your gift! Just regift what you were just given!

on the concept of regifting? And the regifting is done not with unwanted gifts, but with the very best gifts we've ever been given!

After all, when Jesus sent his first disciples out on their first missionary and as you remember.

Since I don't want it, I'll regift it! But here's the

question for us this Christmas: What if the whole

After all, when Jesus sent his first disciples out on their first missionary endeavor, do you remember what he said to them? He first reminded them of all the good gifts they had been given, and then he said to them: "Freely you have received; freely give" (Matthew 10:8, TNIV. Italics added).

This Christmas, then, I challenge you to *regift* the best gifts you've ever received! If you take up that challenge, there could be a surprise in store for you: it just could turn out to be your best Christmas ever. . . .

The term, though, refers to gifts we don't want.
